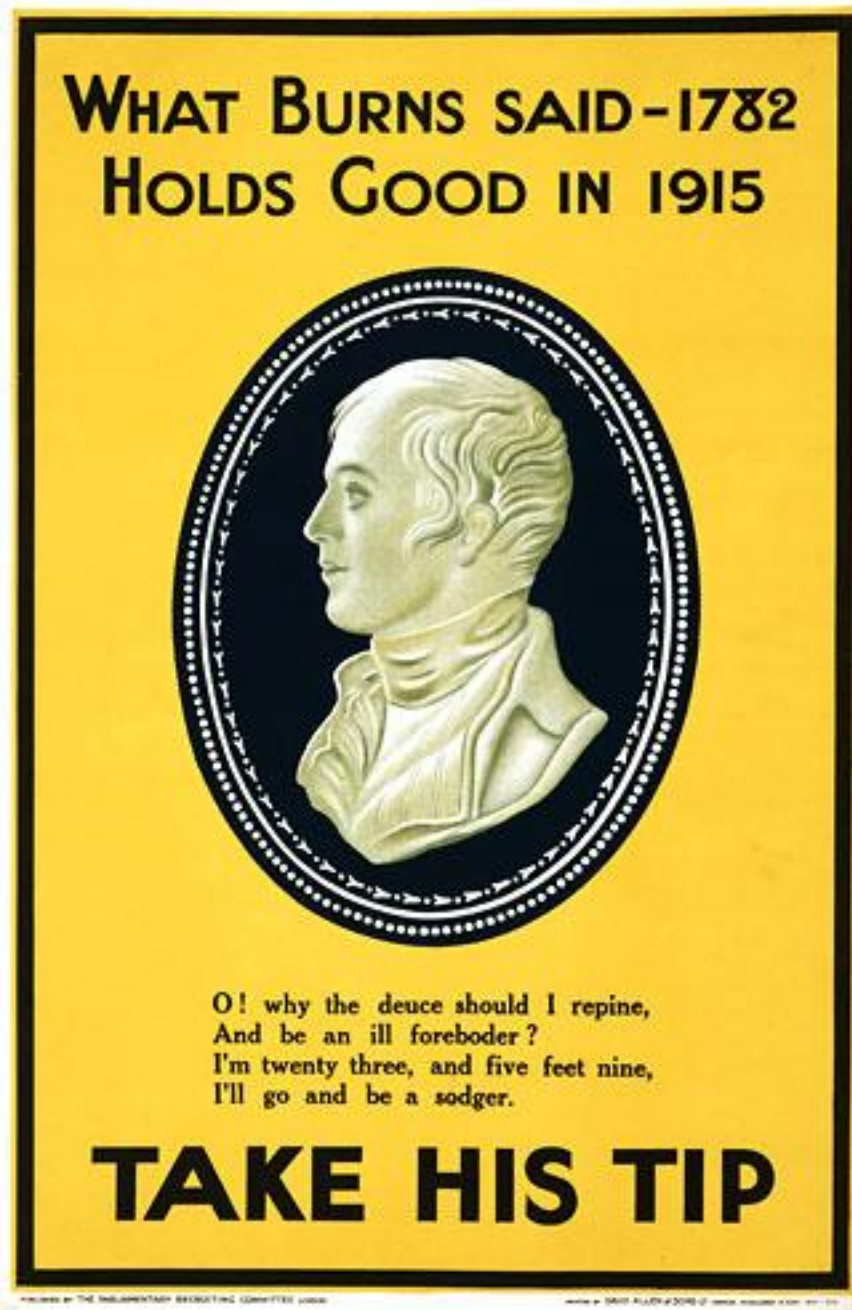

Appendix 3 – First World War Servicemen Profiles

Presbyterian Church in Ireland (PCI) Roll of Honour

The congregational listings have a tendency to record the Regiment by initials only and RIR could refer to the Royal Irish Rifles or the Royal Irish Regiment – unless otherwise specified, it has been assumed that RIR means Royal Irish Rifles.

For Royal Irish Rifles servicemen, the congregational listings sometimes use rank “Rifleman” and sometimes the rank “Private”. For simplicity and consistency, the Rank of any man below the rank of Lance-Corporal is recorded as “Rifleman”.

Whilst the PCI Roll of Honour lists for the Crescent and Donegall Pass congregations contain extensive information, the list for Fitzroy Avenue is somewhat spartan (being limited to Forename, Surname and whether wounded/died/PoW).

The lists do contain some errors, spelling of names and/or house numbers, and duplications:

- The PCI Roll of Honour for Fitzroy Avenue (and its War Memorial plaque) include a Dr. Bryson Hogg and a Gerald Hogg MB (no address details) whilst the Donegall Pass list includes a Bryson Hogg MD and a Gerald Hogg MD, both of Ormeau Road;
- The Fitzroy Avenue and Crescent lists both include a Philip W Frew;
- The Fitzroy Avenue and Crescent lists both include a William Baxter;
- The Fitzroy Avenue list has a Jack Hunter (wounded) whilst the Crescent list has a J D Hunter (wounded);
- The Crescent list contains a Samuel D. Allan (Royal Irish Rifles) and a Samuel D. Allen (Royal Flying Corps), both of whom are recorded as living at 20 Maryville Street. As an Ernest Allen is also listed for the Maryville address, only the Samuel D Allen entry has been retained. An examination of the Belfast Street Directories for the period fails to show a family called Allen or Allan living at 20 Maryville Street (unless it was as lodgers);
- Where there are variants in the spelling of forenames or surnames (e.g. McCallum/McCollam, Legge/Legg, Edmond/Edmund), both versions have been included.

There are some names on the memorial plaques in the Church vestibule which are not on the relevant PCI Roll of Honour (for example, Alfred and Herbert Thorpe of Crescent) and names which are on the PCI Roll of Honour but not on the relevant War Memorial plaque (for example, Adrian Thompson of Crescent).

The Donegall Pass War Memorial records “Pte. T Halliday” as a fatality but the PCI Roll of Honour entry for the congregation records that Thomas Halliday was a Lieutenant.

The PCI Roll of Honour lists include people who had moved to Dominion territories or America – for example, the McAlister brothers (Donegall Pass congregation) who were living in Toronto and the Gordon brothers (Crescent congregation) whose parents re-settled in Boston (USA).

Addresses

In addition to the details on the PCI Rolls of Honour, addresses have also been obtained from the Ireland Census returns for 1901 and 1911 and from Street Directories.

The census returns only records people (including visitors) who were residing at the property on Sunday 31st March 1901 and Sunday 2nd April 1911, and would exclude family members who happened to be away from home on that specific evening – for example, PCI Roll of Honour for Donegall Pass lists William and Richard Gourley of 3 Elm Street, but only Richard appears on the 1911 Census return.

Sometimes the Census Enumerators recorded “number of the house in the street” rather than the postal house number – consequently, there are discrepancies between the details recorded on the Census Returns and in the Belfast Street Directories.

On a number of occasions, the details in the returns (including street names and personal names) have been incorrectly transcribed on the website.

The Ireland Census records have been used to verify/identify addresses and identify additional information:

- where a family was residing at a different address to the one listed in the PCI Roll of Honour, the address from the 1911 Census has also been included;
- where a house number on the Census Return differs from the PCI Roll of Honour – for example, W.J. and G.G. Ervine of Magdala Street – the House Number from the 1911 Census has been included;
- where no address details are recorded in the PCI Roll of Honour, the 1911 Census records for the surrounding wards (i.e. Cromac, Windsor, St. George’s and Ormeau) have been searched for possible.

The year at which the family lived at various addresses has been recorded and, where the Street Directories and Census Returns differ, both addresses have been included. The addresses without any date are ones where the details have come from a PCI Roll of Honour and could not be verified.

Where an address has been identified for a family in the 1901 or 1911 Ireland Census but the named serviceman does not appear on return, it has been assumed that the address is the parental home – for example, the 1901 Census return for 9 Bruce Street includes Benjamin Barrett but does not include “A Barrett” but both are listed for the same address in the PCI Roll of Honour for the Crescent congregation.

Commonwealth War Graves Commission

On a few occasions, the “Age at Death” recorded on the CWGC Debt of Honour Register does not match other records, for example:

Harry Andrew Gordon – the Canadian Attestation document records his Date of Birth as 29th May 1894 and the CWGC Register records his Date of Death as 24th January 1919 and his age as 23 not 24;

Thomas Edward Gordon – the Canadian Attestation document records his Date of Birth as 5th November 1888 and the CWGC Register records his Date of Death as 5th April 1918 and his age as 30 not 29;

John McLaughlin – the Canadian Attestation document records his Date of Birth as 2nd November 1883 and the CWGC Register records his Date of Death as 2nd February 1915 and his age as 26. The 1911 Ireland Census Return records that he was 21 on 2nd April 1911, which accords with the 1889 birth year held on the Ulster Historical Foundation website. This would have made him either 24 or 25 when he was killed.

David Thompson – the 1911 Ireland Census Return records that he was 17 years old on 2nd April 1911, which would make him 23 or 24 when he was killed on 16th August 1917. The Commonwealth War Graves Commission Register records him as being 20 when he was killed.

General

Additional family, professional and war service information has been identified for some of the servicemen and this information is included in the ***Great War – Servicemen Biographies*** chapters – an * appears after the name of the relevant men.

The various addresses at which the men (or their families) lived before and during the war are also recorded, with the year in which they started living at those addresses.

Date of Birth – where the specific Date of Birth is not known, the Age recorded on the 1911 Ireland Census Return has been used to calculate the two years (e.g. April 1890 to March 1891) in which the birth would have taken place. Where possible, online genealogy websites have been used to try to identify the actual year and/or month of birth.

Unit – men often moved between Battalions and between Regiments; and regiments often moved between Brigades and Divisions. Consequently, men might have served in other Battalions, Regiments, Brigades and Division to those specified. For many men (generally those with links to Fitzroy Avenue Presbyterian Church), there is no Unit information at all.
